## Student example of working virtually: Elementary Daily Routine

Elementary student A (**Grade 5**) starts with Math or L/A but both of those subjects are usually at the start of the day. We start between 9:00 and 10:00am. Once she completes those two, she will usually take a break (either play outside or with the animals) then she will complete History or Science depending on the day (they alternate) or if she wants to work ahead, she does both. Then it's lunch time and she usually will end with P.E. Student A pretty much ends her day between 2:00 and 3:00 (depending if she has worked ahead in a subject or not) This was the first year she was kind of on her own. FLVS was a great transition year for her (from K-12). Of course, if she needed help, I was there, or she would text or call Mrs. Kline.

For student B (**Grade KG**), this will be the first year I am doing Elementary in FLVS but when he was in K-12 again we would work on core classes and then the others (same for pretty much all of them) The only difference with Student B is I have to sit with him to do his classes which would take around four to five hours. The other children all work on their own at his point.

Of course, we integrate the class connects. school outings, DBA's and testing when needed. This is a typical day in the SJVS family household! Overall, our day is flexible, and that is the beauty of being in SJVS.

You really must be disciplined and motivated to succeed in SJVS and if you are it is the most rewarding experience you will ever have.
